A FATAL DRUG HIDING IN PLAIN SIGHT

It could endanger your child...or their friend

THE FACTS:

- Overdoses involving fentanyl, a highly dangerous opioid, have spiked around the state, including in Eastern Oregon.
- Young people are dying from taking fentanyl laced pills.
- Youth are getting pills from online sources, as well as friends and associates. Prescription names for fentanyl include Actiq®, Duragesic®, and Sublimaze®
- One pill can contain enough fentanyl to cause a deadly overdose.You can't smell or taste fentanyl.
- No one is immune. This danger affects every community.



<u>Talk to your children</u>

Educate them on the dangers.

Give them a safe space to talk openly, and listen to them without judgment.

Monitor social media use

Drugs may be offered online from a stranger or someone they know.

Know how to help.

If you find someone who may have overdosed, call 911.

Carrying and knowing how to use Narcan can save a life.

Counterfeit Oxycodone

Many counterfeit pills are made to look like prescriptions such as Oxycontin, Percocet, Vicodin, Xanax, or Adderall.

Assume that any "prescription" pill bought outside of normal channels is fake, and very possibly deadly.

WATCH TO WATCH FOR

Behavior changes

For example:

- Low energy
- Lack of interest in activities they once loved
- Irregular eating or sleeping patterns
- General signs of depression or anxiety

These may be normal developmental changes, however still the questions should be asked:

"It seems like you aren't yourself lately. Is there something happening with you?"

Signs of opioid use:

- Pinpoint pupils
- Nodding off during conversation

Signs of an overdose:

- Shallow/slow breathing
- Unresponsiveness
- Vomiting/making gurgling sounds
- Unable to be awakened/speak
- Slow heartbeat
- Blue lips/clammy skin
