



### **Integrated Co-Occurring Disorders (ICD) Treatment Program Approval Process**

OHA Health Systems Division anticipates finalization of the Outpatient Integrated Co-Occurring Disorders Rule – OAR 309-019-0145 – to occur in Mid-January, 2023. When the Rule is finalized, its' effective date will be retroactive to January 1<sup>st</sup>, 2023.

Once the Rule is finalized and published to the Oregon Secretary of State Website, programs will be able to apply for approval as an Integrated Co-Occurring Disorders Service Provider through the Integrated Co-Occurring Disorders website. A web based application form will be available. Applications, once approved, will be effective retroactively to January 1<sup>st</sup>, 2023.

Programs are not required to be awardees or applicants of Start-up funding to apply for Health Systems Division approval as an Integrated Co-Occurring Disorders program.

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The payment methodologies employed for Integrated Co-Occurring Disorders Treatment per OAR 309-19-0145 and forthcoming OAR 309-018-0160 require provider organization approval by OHA HSD. This approval is needed in order to ensure that provider organizations and practitioners are in alignment with intent and practice of Integrated Co-Occurring Disorders Treatment and Recovery Services and to ensure proper payment for these specialty services.

The OHA Integrated Co-Occurring Disorders (ICD) Treatment initiative seeks to eliminate barriers to access and provide meaningful and responsive treatment for Oregonians dealing with Co-Occurring Disorders. In addition to the restructuring of payment methodologies in Medicaid Fee-for-Service and Coordinated Care Organizations, the initiative is working to guide and support organizational culture change as well as support and expand the practice scope and skill set of treatment providers and peer service providers working in ICD settings. For these reasons, the ICD Treatment Program Approval Process focuses on supporting ongoing participation in the culture of change and expansion of specialty scope of practice and skill sets.

Routine Site Reviews conducted by the Certification & Licensing Unit of OHA Health Systems Division (HSD) will include review of compliance with OARs 309-019-0145 and 309-018-0160 as relevant.

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## **ICD Program Application and Approval Process.**

### **1. Current Certification/License of Approval**

Current SUD and/or MH Certification/License of Approval submitted in application.

### **2. Staffing (Per OARs 3069-019-0125, 309-019-0145, 309-018-0160 revision forthcoming)**

(program to attest to meeting these requirements and commit to best efforts to maintain adherence to these requirements)

- a) At least one QMHP Mental Health Provider
- b) At least one SUD provider
- c) At least one Peer Support Specialist
- d) At least one Licensed Medical Provider with capacity to provide direct services
- e) Capacity to provide family therapy
- f) Integrated Co-Occurring Disorders Problem Gambling Specialist Identified
- g) Supervisor(s) identified to supervise staff listed above per OARs

### **3. Submission of ICD provider form (furnished by OHA ICD and available on the OHA ICD**

**website).** (Program to submit initial provider form, and commit to providing quarterly update form) Provider form will include:

- a. Provider name
- b. Provider credentials
- c. Provider Medicaid number
- d. Provider NPI
- e. Other CCO tracking information as relevant
- f. Status of completion of ICD required trainings

Submission of ICD provider form (furnished by OHA ICD) 30 days following the end of each calendar quarter after quarter of initial approval will be required for billing purposes.

### **4. Provider Staff Training:** (program to attest/commit to prioritizing staff training completion within one year as directed by Rule)

Provider staff will complete ICD required training per OAR 309-019-0145. Training will be published on the Integrated Co-Occurring Disorders Website. Training will be available in several formats (online, self-paced and live trainings):

### **5. Integrated Co-Occurring Disorders Policies & Procedures:** Per OAR 309-019-0110 “programs shall develop and implement written service delivery policies and specific procedures compliant with these rules.” Program will submit Integrated Co-Occurring Disorders Policy and Procedure

with initial application for approval. Applicable Rules include but may not be limited to 309-0109-0145, 309-019-0170, 3069-019-0185, 309-019-0200,

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### **ICD Program Development and Staff Support and Technical Assistance**

OHA ICD staff are available for informal and structured Technical Assistance for Development of Integrated Co-Occurring Disorders programs. The structured tools detailed below are aligned with meeting requirements of ICD OAR 309-019-0145 and forthcoming 309-018-0160.

Registered/approved ICD programs are strongly encouraged to participate in ongoing program development technical assistance provided by OHA at no cost. The activities below are not required but are, again, strongly encouraged.

#### **Program Development Snapshot**

Completion of OHA ICD Program Snapshot collaboratively with OHA ICD staff within 120 days of initial approval. ICD Program Development Roadmap created collaboratively with OHA ICD staff from information gathered in the OHA ICD Snapshot.

#### **Integrated Co-Occurring Disorders Treatment Program Roadmap Check-ins**

The ICD Program Development Roadmap will identify program development focus areas. At least one collaborative, developmentally oriented discussion between OHA ICD and program staff every six months to review Program Development Roadmap. OHA ICD recommends quarterly review of the Roadmap. Programs are advised to update the OHA ICD snapshot at their scheduled Site Review with the Division.

#### **DDCAT/DDCMHT**

OHA ICD encourages but does not require completion of the DDCAT/DDCMHT in the technical assistance process. Completion of the DDCAT (Dual Diagnosis Capability in Addictions Treatment) or DDCMHT (Dual Diagnosis Capability in Mental Health Treatment) Indices. The DDCAT and DDCMHT are internationally recognized and validated tools for assessing treatment organization capacity to provide Co-Occurring Disorders Treatment. OHA ICD will use DDCAT and DDCMHT data to inform program development and conduct structural outcomes studies and program evaluation.

#### **Provider Staff Participation in ICD Project ECHO/Consultation Groups**
